Recent reforms in California have expanded oversight and enforcement mechanisms for localities to comply with state housing laws and plan for local and regional housing needs. This research interrogates how state-level intervention has driven shifts in housing policies in Orange County. Affluent coastal, canyon, and southern cities have been notably resistant to policy change. Meanwhile, lower-middle-income cities, closer to Los Angeles, have leveraged state laws to pass tenant protections in response to political pressure from residents and local activists. Local governments in general, however, are facing pressure to address the acute housing needs of increasingly diverse and mobilized constituents, opting to roll back voter initiatives that restrict development, implement or expand inclusionary zoning ordinances, establish housing funds, and use public land for affordable housing construction. Building upon an assessment of city-level housing conditions, strategies, and policy shifts, we seek to study successful affordable housing strategies, and their implementation processes, by carrying out surveys, interviews, and focus groups with relevant stakeholders in the county.
