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The COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted school learning and families. Currently, we are partnering with local schools and non-profits to identify families in need of support with remote learning. We are then matching students with UCI undergraduates, known as Community Education Fellows, to facilitated supportive learning pods. Learning pods are small groupings of students for socialization, education, and play. Learning Pods have the potential to be an innovative solution for families faced with remote learning in the COVID era. Learning pods are designed to support students' social-emotional needs an facilitate small group learning. Many caregivers and schools are searching for ways to provide personal attention and support to students as they attend virtual or hybrid schooling options. While many private options are proliferating at this time, we believe equitable and community-driven approaches are vital to help each other in this critical moment. This initiative arose through the combination of support from many individuals and programs. The UCI Office of Inclusive Excellence awarded a seed grant to Dr. Ahn (and colleagues) of the Orange County Educational Advancement Network to create research and response projects to aid local communities impacted by COVID-19. Dr. Ahn and doctoral candidate Yenda Prado created a work group focused on helping families in need, searching for extra support for their child's virtual learning. The goal of mitigating the extreme inequality that is arising from the pandemic and developments such as learning pods and hiring tutors, was a prime aim for this working group.
