About the Organization:

The OC Food Bank distributes over 21 million pounds of food each year to vulnerable people. Nearly 400 other charities rely on the Food Bank for the food they distribute. Those organizations include churches, soup kitchens, senior centers, shelters, community centers, and social service agencies. Those charities feed seniors on fixed incomes, individuals with disabilities, the unemployed, homeless persons, and the working poor. The Food Bank also feeds 1,400 people directly each day in communities throughout the region. The Food Bank is part of a larger private nonprofit organization - The Community Action Partnership of Orange County.

About the Field Study Placement

SEVERAL INTERNSHIPS ARE AVAILABLE: Students can work in the OC Food Bank or any of the CAPOC Departments. Admin duties include: fund reporting, outcome tracking, program development. Program duties include: phone screening, research, client interviews, client surveys, and other special assignments. Interns have the opportunity to learn more about the many facets of poverty in Orange County, including childhood hunger, transportation, the utility crisis, environmental health issues for children living in poverty, school and after school issues, housing, and the concerns of seniors living in poverty.

Interns will also have the opportunity to join collaborative meetings with other agencies and organizations in Orange County, which address poverty issues.

Requirements

Willingness to learn. An interest in public administration, program development, and the non-profit sector is recommended but not required. Recommendation of the Field Instructor is required.

Orange County Children's Therapeutic Arts Center (OCCTAC) offers high-quality, comprehensive-multicultural curriculum and programs that combine arts, academics, and creative therapies to empower youth, adults and seniors. The MECCA programs focus on serving seniors in the community. The Outreach and Engagement Program (O&E) provides culturally acceptable, multilingual services to prevent or lessen the development of mental health conditions through intervention. O&E provides short-term life coaching/case management, access to various types of classes, therapeutic arts, counseling as well as referrals and linkages to existing community resources. The ReCONNECT Socialization Program provides isolated adults in Orange County with the opportunity to reintegrate into the community by incorporating healthy activities into their daily lifestyle and improving their quality of life.

About the Field Study Placement

Field study students will work with case management, visiting participants, course/class/workshop coordination, program management, data entry, report creation, outreach, and/or community work. Through their work, students will have the opportunity to participate and observe social issues in the areas of prevention and early intervention in health care and issues prevalent with the underserved or marginalized communities.

Requirements

Computer skills (basic), good writing skills, willingness to work with adults and seniors. Bilingualism is encouraged.

Call and sign up for earliest OCCTAC volunteer orientation. Then select appropriate program within OCCTAC (each program has its own process). Additional training, meetings and background check for MECCA Programs. The cost will be covered by MECCA/OCCTAC.
