Existing evaluations of text- message based reminders of court appearances have been found to substantially reduce the probability that a defendant fails to appear (FTA) in court, but this strategy has not been tested among hard-to-reach populations such as people experiencing housing instability. Field study assistants will oversee the implementation of a 2-3 month randomized controlled trial of the impact of text-message based reminders at reducing FTAs among misdemeanor defendants in Shasta County, CA, including an over-sample of people experiencing housing instability at the time of offense. Tasks will involve regularly monitoring random assignment, uploading data to a secure website, and providing descriptive information on the experimental sample to research team.
